CUPE Local 3324 Paramedics and Island EMS – Parties have reached a tentative agreement.

Charlottetown – “Early Friday morning the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) Local 3324, and Island EMS have reached a tentative agreement. We will now present the tentative agreement to our members for ratification,” says Jason Woodbury, President of CUPE Local 3324.

CUPE Local 3324 represents all Paramedics on Prince Edward Island and they have been without a collective agreement since December 31st, 2019. An interest arbitration date was set for early December of this year.

“We believe the tentative agreement is a fair and respectful deal. Our bargaining team will be recommending the members ratify the agreement,” says Woodbury.

CUPE Local 3324 has scheduled ratification meetings across the province for early next week and expects the process to be completed by the middle of next week.

“The two sides worked extremely hard throughout the entire process and we are pleased that both parties were able to reach an agreement, so we can bring it to our members for ratification,” concluded Woodbury.
